ED3314 Principles of Administration, 3 credit hours, Moody Distance Learning Online ONLY

Course Description

This course establishes a theology of administration and identifies basic strategies for effective administration in ministry. Teachings and examples found in Scripture are combined with proven ministry experience to describe five key elements of effective administration: planning, organizing, recruiting, leading, and evaluating. The student will practice strategies of effective administration by applying it in a ministry context.

Course Goals

In this course you will:

- Understand and articulate a Theology of Administration
- Understand and articulate similarities and differences between administration, management, and leadership
- Understand the components of a healthy organization
- Understand personality and leadership styles in leadership and administration

Course Objectives

After completing this course you should be able to:

- 1. Articulate a biblical theology of administration in writing
- 2. Define terms such as Administration, Management, and Leadership
- 3. Describe the "sheep" of a healthy organization
- 4. Explain different personality and leadership styles
- 5. Create an electronic and hard copy file system

Assignments

There are 727 pages of textbook reading. Leaders are readers. Also provided are notes on books in the field of leadership, administration and management. There are two reflective reading papers on two of the textbooks and a written project that will become the beginnings of an office manual.

1. READING REPORT:

The completion of the course reading is an important part of the course. You are expected to complete the reading prior to class for discussion purposes. You will be required to submit a reading report at the end of each week.

2. **REFLECTIVE READING:**

You are required to complete two 5-8-page reflection papers. The purpose of the reflection papers is for you to gain a better understanding of yourself, your personality style, your spiritual giftedness, temperament, leadership role and style.

Reflective Reading #1: The first reflection paper is on the Voges and Braund text and the Aubrey Malphurs website documents. How has this text helped you better understand a difficult working and/or church relationship? How do you understand your personality style and how do you feel you have been misunderstood? How and what will you do differently in future similar situations? How do you feel having a clearer understanding of personality traits will affect how you respond to people and situations?

Due by the end of Week 4.

Reflective Reading #2: The second reflection paper will be on Anthony and Estep text. The text is broken into six (6) main parts. Write a reflection paper of one page per section. Interact with what you feel are the most important ideas in each of the main sections. What concepts were new? What "ah ha" moments helped you to better understand situations in a current or previous ministry?

Due by the end of Week 8.

3. PROJECT:

You are required to complete a project that includes the following elements: You are strongly encouraged to follow the course schedule and complete the project in stages rather than attempt to compile and submit at the end of the semester.

- b. A yearly financial budget for a ministry that receives \$130,000 per year. Identify ministries (include education), physical plant resources, human resources, financial resources, office resources, ministry program plans and evaluation. This should be an Excel workbook. (Text pgs 115-132)
- c. Job Description for a ministry leadership role such as Senior/Solo Pastor (Text pgs 174-189)
- d. Develop an evaluative tool to determine the success of a Program or an Employee Progress Review:
 - An Employee and Program (Text pgs 396-416)
- e. Develop a monthly reporting system that tracks the following for a ministry:
 - Monthly contacts (phone, email, face to face meetings
 - Secondary service provider contacts
 - Special projects accomplished in the month

Due by the end of Week 8.

4. CLASS PARTICIPATION:

Attendance is also expected. You must maintain a significant presence in all 15 discussion boards. Online discussion questions will be taken from Voges and Braund, and Anthony and Estep texts. Please refer to the discussion board rubric included in the *Course Resources* section of this course for more information on how your participation in the discussion board will be assessed.

5. QUIZZES:

Complete four (4) quizzes. All Quiz questions come from the Anthony and Estep text.

- a. Quiz 1: 10 questions from Chapters 1-2, pages 13-49
- b. Quiz 2: 23 questions from Chapters 3-8, pages 57-153
- c. Quiz 3: 40 questions from Chapters 9-23, pages 160-233
- d. Quiz 4: 27 questions from Chapters 13-23, pages 251-390

The quizzes are closed-book and will be timed at 15 minutes for Quiz 1, 30 minutes for Quiz 2, 45 minutes for Quiz 3, and 30 minutes for Quiz 4.
