Project Brief

Project Overview:

The Emotions Snapshots program empowers students in grades 4-7 to explore their emotions and tell their stories through photography. Partnering with 100cameras, the program integrates creative expression and technical skills to foster personal growth and community connection. It culminated in a public art exhibition, showcasing participants' photographs and celebrating their unique perspectives.

Deliverables:

- A fully developed photography curriculum tailored for library settings.
- A series of photography workshops led by library staff.
- Cameras provided for participants to use during the program.
- A public art exhibition displaying selected works from participants.
- Marketing materials and outreach to promote the program and exhibition.

Objectives:

- Encourage self-expression and emotional literacy in students through photography.
- Provide participants with foundational photography skills and techniques.
- Create a platform for youth to share their stories with the community.
- Foster connections between the library and local families, enhancing community engagement.

Key Stakeholders:

- Participants: Students in grades 4-7 who took part in the program.
- Parents and Families: Supported and celebrated the students' achievements.
- 100cameras: Provided the photography curriculum and guidance.
- Springdale Public Library: Organized and hosted the program.
- Community Partners: Supported the exhibition, including local media and donors.

estudiantes universitarios normales", agregó. "Incluso, una de ellos, Fran, ahora trabaja con nosotros, es un buen ejemplo de lo que se puede lograr".

"Estamos agradecidos de que estemos aquí en Carroll County", continuó. "Nuestras clases dan créditos universitarios: por ejemplo, en el programa de CNA, los alumnos de preparatoria salen certificados como CNA y de allí pueden entrar directo al programa de ORN. Muchos alumnos de la prepa están tomando clases de matemáti-

cas e historia, y luego transfieren sus créditos a la Universidad de Arkansas o Arkansas Tech. Tenemos una alumna que está sacando su diploma de la preparatoria y su Associate of Arts universitario a la vez. Saldrá a los 18 años como junior, podrá entrar directo al tercer año de la universidad. Somos socios con las preparatorias de Eureka Springs, Berryville y Green Forest. Es algo muy bueno, es algo que se necesita. La idea es ir mas allá de la Tyson y empoderar oportunidades, para que nuestros estudiantes sientan que van a poder salir de aquí con la esperanza de algo mejor", dijo.

Linda comentó que Carroll County tiene una comunidad muy diversa y que hay muchos hispanos, menciona-

ndo la Fiesta de la Independencia de Latinoamérica el 14 de septiembre (ver nota en nuestra sección especial). "Me encanta Carroll County", enfatizó. "Es muy diverso. Tenemos nuestras tiendas y nuestra comunidad está bien integrada. ¡Es un NWA en chiquito!"

Isabel Piña, quien es Administradora del Departamento de Fuerza Laboral en el centro de Carroll County y cuyos papás son de San Juan del Río, Qro. e Iztapalapa, CDMX, respectivamente, dijo que por el momento solo se tiene un edificio, "pero nuestra meta es tener un campus para poder servir a todas las comunidades".

"Tenemos muchos estudiantes de primera generación", continuó Isabel. "Sus papás hablan español. Muchas fa-

miliars piensan que la universidad está muy cara, pero no tienen que empezar con una tan cara. No conocen el proceso, no saben de las universidades, de las ayudas de FAFSA, de las becas. La gente hispana tiene la comodidad de poder estudiar aquí. Hay mucho que hacer en Carroll County, y estamos tratando de que el centro crezca más".

North Arkansas College está buscando profesores de matemáticas, computación e historia, para que pueda crecer. "Es difícil conseguir profesore es importante que vengan para que se pueda seguir ofreciendo los cursos. Estamos reclutando", dijo Linda. "El estudio es la mejor inversión", concluyó.

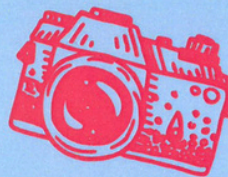

Each week, participants will join other kids to explore different feelings like happiness, kindness, and even how to stay strong when things get tough.



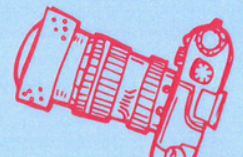
They'll talk about what these feelings mean and then capture them in photos. Imagine showing how much you care about your friends with a picture or capturing the joy of a sunny day with a camera!

Emotions Snapshots: un enfoque juvenil a NWA

SPRINGDALE - El pasado miércoles se inauguró la exposición de fotografía juvenil Emotions Snapshots en la biblioteca pública de Springdale. Vale la pena visitar la exposición: la calidad de algunas de las fotos es asombrosa tomando en cuenta la edad de los niños participantes, y mas allá del resultado, lo más importante ha sido el proceso de aprendizaje, utilizando un objeto que en la última década ha casi desaparecido de nuestras vidas: la cámara fotográfica.

Emotions Snapshots es una colaboración entre Springdale Public Library, la organización 100 Cameras y el Arkansas Department of Parks, Heritage & Tourism (ADPHT). Los niños que participaron son de Springdale y son de 4° a 7° grado. A la inauguración asistieron los jóvenes fotógrafos y sus familiares, hubo un grupo de música folclórica irlandesa, y por supuesto estuvo Elizabeth Hurtado, bibliotecaria, quien estuvo guiando a los niños durante todo el proyecto. Elizabeth es dominicana y lleva ocho años viviendo en Arkansas; anteriormente fue periodista en su país.

"Todo empezó en una reunión del personal en febrero", explicó Elizabeth. "Nos dimos cuenta de que teníamos problemas con los adolescentes en la biblioteca, no respetaban las instalaciones, ni el área de niños. Nos pusimos a buscar una forma en que los adolescentes pudieran utilizar su energía para ayudar a la comunidad, y

fue así como dimos con 100 Cameras". 100 Cameras es una organización que suministra cámaras - con un costo unitario de poco menos de cien dólares - y un plan pedagógico para la actividad. La biblioteca se puso a buscar fondos y así fue como se aliaron con ADPHT para financiar el proyecto. En el caso de Springdale, por cuestiones de tiempo y por la edad de los niños, se modificó el programa más extenso de ocho módulos, llevando a cabo el programa en solo cinco semanas y realizando la mayor parte de la fotografía en la semana y el fin de semana antes de la inauguración.

"Hicimos algo más accesible para los niños", dijo Elizabeth. "Como era una combinación de trabajo visual y escrito, los padres nos ayudaron con la parte escrita para que estuviera todo listo para la exposición. Los dos últimos días estuve imprimiendo las fotos y enmarcándolas", dijo Elizabeth, cansada pero feliz.

Dentro de los niños hay varios hispanos, como Itzae Martínez, un niño mexicano-nicaragüense-estadounidense, Grayson Macías, y Katherine Morales, hija de Tatiana Morales, bibliotecaria de vinculación multicultural. Uno de los elementos más importantes del proyecto fue el aprender a usar una cámara fotográfica. "Podían usar el celular, pero lo interesante era que usaran la cámara", dijo Elizabeth. "Es otra herramienta, tuvieron que aprender el proceso y sacar fotos con menos trucos. El celular te facilita la vida, pero lo importante era que pusieran en práctica lo que habían

aprendido".

Las 25 cámaras que se usaron para el proyecto se guardaron y se utilizarán con otros niños; también se está viendo la posibilidad de llevar a cabo una actividad similar con adultos. También, la biblioteca tiene mochilas didácticas disponibles con actividades en español e inglés como acuarela, origami, Legos... ¡y fotografía!



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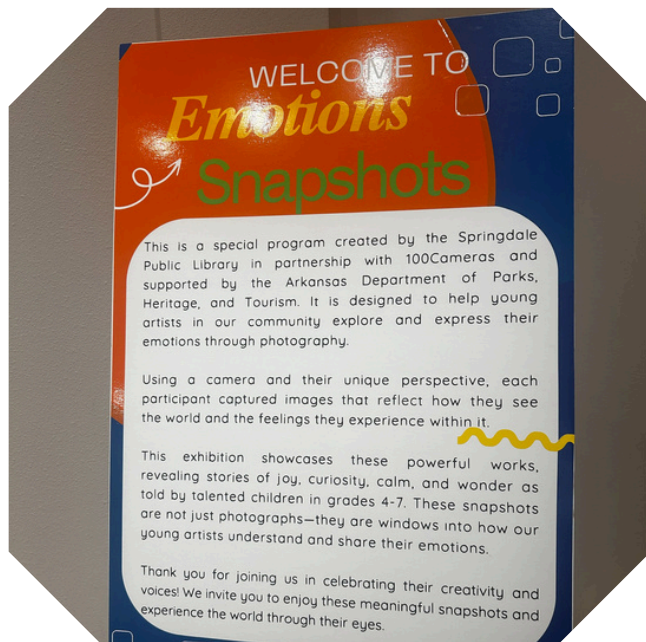

The Emotions Snapshots program exceeded expectations in several key areas, demonstrating the power of creativity and storytelling within our community.

Program Impact:

Participants showcased remarkable growth in their confidence, artistic abilities, and ability to express emotions through photography. The community well-received the final exhibition, highlighting the importance of providing youth with platforms to share their voices.

Attendance and Demographics:

With 17 participants from diverse backgrounds, the program engaged a meaningful cross-section of our community. Despite targeted outreach efforts to include members of the Marshallese community, no participation was recorded from this group, providing an area for improvement in future outreach strategies.

Library Enhancements:

The program has contributed to expanding library resources and services, including two STEAM backpacks and 23 cameras available for future programs. The photographs from the exhibition will serve as a creative and inspiring addition to the decor of the newly expanded ChildreChildren'sment.

Emotions Snapshots has set a strong foundation for future programming, underscoring the library's role as a hub for creativity, learning, and community connection.
